

Prop 30	YES	Prop 30 will generate sorely needed revenue for California schools and services by taxing the wealthiest in our State and with an increased sales tax.
Prop 31	NO	This initiative is costly and would give unbalanced power to the Governor. We believe it would only hurt the California budget further.
Prop 32	NO	Prop 32 is plain and simple an attack on California workers. It would take power away from teachers, firefighters, and nurses but do nothing to limit corporate influence on our elections.
Prop 33	NO	Prop 33, championed by a large insurance company, would make profit for insurance companies by preying on poor and un-insured Californians.
Prop 34	YES	We are opposed to the death penalty. Prop 34 gives California the chance to end this inhumane practice.
Prop 35	NO	We are opposed to human trafficking and sexual violence in all of its forms. However, we don't think Prop 35 is the answer because its wording is too vague and it relies too heavily on an already broken justice system.
Prop 36	YES	Prop 36 makes long overdue shifts in California's Three Strikes rule so that our prisons are less overflowing with non-violent and non-serious offenders. This reform could save California up to \$100 million annually.
Prop 37	YES	We believe all of us deserve to know what is in the foods we eat.
Prop 38	NO	Prop 38 is a regressive tax that we cannot support. Although we recognize that our schools face a deep budget crisis, taxing the poorest Californians is not the answer.
Prop 39	YES	We strongly believe that corporations must pay their fair share of taxes, especially in our hurting economy.
Prop 40	YES	We believe the Citizens Redistricting Commission process was fair and should be upheld.
